1. To Receive Apologies for Absence

There were no apologies from the Parish Council.

2. To receive declarations of interest and agree dispensations (if any)

There were none.

3. To approve the minutes of the Parish Council Meeting held on Monday 5th July 2021.

The minutes were unanimously **AGREED** by the Council and signed by the Chairman as a true record.

4. To report progress on items not on the agenda from the last meeting (Clerk's report)

The Playpark organisers had been contacted about the £500 contribution from Tattersett PC, that was agreed at the July meeting. They had not replied as yet, so there was no progress on this matter. All other matters were dealt with on the agenda.

5. To Receive updates from Councillors, Public Bodies etc

5.1 Cllr Tom Fitzpatrick provided a report, which gave updates on several matters, including funding for broadband of £195 million, 30% of which had been allocated for North Norfolk, as it is behind the rest of the country. DA asked how decisions on which areas to benefit from this fund are made. TF agreed to lobby for Tattersett to be included. TF also reported on a Road Safety Community fund, which may be used for improvements to the Four Winds junction. Other subjects included the Flood Alliance and that County Council staff are continuing to work from home, where possible.

5.2 Mark White gave a report regarding Wicken Green. The report covered subjects including road resurfacing, which is largely self-funded, as well as hedge and grass maintenance and the installation of 2 new 20 speed limit signs. There was a discussion concerning Tattersett Business Park and some concerns about a building that had been demolished without sufficient safety measures in place. A possible proposal for a solar farm on the site was also discussed. THP and ADC thanked MW for organising a recent, very successful visit with the local MP.

6. Finance

6.1 To consider the financial statement. The financial statement had been circulated by email. This was **agreed**.

6.2 To approve the payment of accounts list. This was **agreed**.

10. Tyre Mountain, Tattersett Business Park, update.

In respect to the proposal on Tattersett Business Park, it had been hoped that there would be a development on the site, that would require removal of the tyre mountain. This proposed development has encountered difficulty and may not go ahead as hoped. Therefore, there was no progress on the tyre mountain.

13.2 To receive new applications and comment. There were two applications to consider.

12. [Broadband Proposal for Tatterford](#)

RP presented an estimate of £46,808 from Openreach to bring fibre broadband, promising speeds of up to 1Gb/s to 52 premises in Tatterford. Openreach have promised to cover all costs for the project that fall within their commercial threshold and there may be vouchers and further funding, such as Community Fibre, that may be available to contribute to the overall cost.

ADC thanked RP for his work in this matter and generously offered to allow there to be a corridor across his estate if it meant that it would cut costs.

RP proposed a £10,000 donation from Tattersett PC, that may have to be borrowed, and this may be considered at a future meeting.
